GIVE BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF WHAT HAPPENED:

On Wednesday, November 7, 2012, at approximately 2107 hours, members of the Metropolitan Police Department were notified of a car fire in the rear of 1401 Brentwood Parkway NE, Washington, DC (Hamilton Junior High School). Upon their arrival, a late model Lincoln Town Car (Taxi Cab) was observed to be fully engulfed in flames. District of Columbia Fire and EMS, Engine 26, responded and extinguished the fire. Further investigation of the vehicle revealed an adult male inside of the vehicle in the driver's seat. The victim's body was subsequently transported to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner for the District of Columbia, pending an autopsy. The victim was identified as Mr. Quader Muhammed.

On Thursday, November 8, 2012, an autopsy was conducted on the remains of Mr. Quader Muhammed, hereinafter referred to as the decedent, by Dr. Chen of the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner for the District of Columbia. Based on the examination, Dr. Chen determined the cause of death to be a single gunshot to the head. The manner of death was ruled to be a homicide.

On Thursday, November 8, 2012, the Baltimore County Police Department made notification to the Metropolitan Police Department that a caller, hereinafter referred to as W-3, indicated that IT had information regarding the shooting of a taxi driver that occurred in Washington, D.C. Detectives from the Metropolitan Police Department responded and met with members of the Baltimore County Police Department. W-3 advised that two witnesses, hereinafter referred to as W-1 and W-2, had information about this shooting.

W-1 and W-2 were located and interviewed individually by detectives.

On Friday, November 9, 2012, W-1 indicated that a female, hereinafter referred to as S-1, made contact with the witnesses within the past 48 hours. S-1 stated to W-1 that she and her boyfriend robbed the cab driver and she (S-1) went to a computer and looked up the incident on the internet. S-1 typed in "Dead body found by burning taxi in Washington, D.C." Both S-1 and W-1 watched the video on the computer.

CONTINUANCE OF BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF WHAT HAPPENED: (PAGE 2 OF 3)

On Friday, November 09, 2012, W-2 was interviewed and stated that S-1 had shown IT a bruise on her leg. S-1 then stated "My boyfriend and I killed a cab driver."

On Friday, November 09, 2012, based on this information provided by W-1 and W-2, Homicide Detectives located and interviewed S-1. During the initial interview at Baltimore County Police Department, S-1 provided multiple versions of what happened the night the taxi driver was shot. Initially, S-1 provided that she and her boyfriend Josh Mebane, hereinafter referred to as the defendant, were in a car accident with a cab driver in Washington, D.C. After the accident, she and the defendant fled the vehicle and went back to their hotel.

Ultimately, S-1 provided additional information that the defendant, who she described as her boyfriend, and she were in Washington D.C., and had gotten a hotel room at the Motel 6 and were low on money. At some point in the evening, the defendant stated that "Somebody has got to get it," meaning they needed to get some money.

After leaving the hotel and walking around for a while, she and the defendant walked to the Greyhound Bus Station in Washington, D.C. The defendant hailed a cab. Both entered the rear seat. The defendant directed the cab driver to go to the school near the Motel 6. He asked the driver "How much?" and the driver replied \$6.50. The defendant asked the driver if he could break a "fifty." The driver advised that he could.

The defendant was seated behind the driver and S-1 was seated next to the defendant. Once they arrived at the school, the Defendant directed the cab driver to drive to the rear of the school. The defendant reached into his small black sports bag, pulled a single black glove from his bag, and put it on his right hand. The defendant then reached back into the bag, pulled out a black handgun and shot the driver in the back of the skull.

S-1 stated the vehicle suddenly accelerated and went over the embankment and crashed into a tree.

S-1 stated that she meet the defendant online in October of 2012. She and the defendant first met each other in person on November 1, 2012. They have been involved in a romantic relationship since that date. She has seen him almost every day since meeting him. She has been to his house in Waldorf, Maryland.

Based on the aforementioned facts and circumstances it is respectfully requested that a D.C. Superior Court Judge issue an arrest warrant for the Defendant. All events took place in the District of Columbia.
